Chapter 1 Section 2: The Formation of Government

- I. Government Systems
 - a. Unitary System
 - i. Gives all key powers to the national or central government.
 - ii. Central government has the power to create state, provincial or other local governments.
 - iii. Britain, Italy and France
 - b. Federal System
 - i. Divides powers between national, state and local governments.
 - ii. Each level of gov't has sovereignty in some areas.
 - iii. U.S., Canada, Mexico, and Australia
- II. Politics and Government
 - a. Politics- the effort to control or influence the conduct and policies of government.
 - b. Seeking gov't benefits
 - i. Through politics, individuals and groups seek to maximize the benefits they get from government.
 - ii. People also seek to use government to turn their values and beliefs into public policy.
 - c. Importance of Politics
 - i. Through politics, conflicts in society are managed peacefully.
 - d. Special Interests
 - i. The Constitution should promote the interests of all people, not favoring any special groups.
