## **EVALUATE SUPPORT**

To avoid being swayed by a weak argument, it is a good idea to **evaluate the support** and reasoning a writer includes. Here are some weaknesses to watch for.

- Vague language—statements that are unclear
- Irrelevant examples—examples that do not directly relate to the claim
- **Overgeneralizations**—statements too broad to be accurate. Overgeneralizations often use words such as always, never, everyone,
